Since there were no comments or questions from the public, Mayor Ouellette closed the meeting to the public.

The Township Committee, met with Ms. Rae Hutton of NJ Transit to discuss options to resolve an ongoing and increasing parking problem at the light rail station.

Mr. Denton noted that the previous idea to pave a vacant piece of land next to the existing lot is estimated to cost approximately \$50,000. Ms. Hutton indicated that chances were slim that funds of that amount be available and indicated that the township would need to share in the cost. Resources are limited at this time.

Ms. Fitzpatrick suggested that the large rocks be moved and that cars be allowed to park on the grass and also indicated that her understanding is that permission is needed from NJ Transit for Delanco police to enforce no parking on Transit property at Pennsylvania Ave.

A discussion ensued regarding the idea to move the large rocks and allow parking on the grass as an immediate, short-term solution to move the parking off of Pennsylvania Ave. The police would then enforce no parking on Transit property at Pennsylvania Ave.

Mr. Denton indicated that he would continue to look for cheaper alternatives for the expansion of the parking lot.
