Mayor Fitzpatrick asked Mayor Fernand Ouellette to come forward.

Mayor Ouellette stated that it was an honor, a privilege and a pleasure to be Mayor and serve our Community for two years and be a part of the Township Committee for three years and thanked everyone for the opportunity.

Mayor Fitzpatrick read Resolution 2009-67 to the public.

Mayor Ouellette stated that the work that the Township Committee and the Mayor and Deputy Mayor along with the staff supporting them is what keeps the Township going. Mayor Ouellette stated that it takes a bunch of people to make things work and we have great folks to serve our Community. Mayor Ouellette stated that to be honored with this plaque and the resolution; that it really belongs to all the folks that serve our Community.

The Township Committee members individually made comments about Mayor Ouellette and thanked him for his service and dedication to the Township of Delanco.

The Township Committee members thanked and applauded Bobby Davison for his achievement in the spelling bee. Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that they looked forward to seeing him next year as the first place winner.

**RESOLUTION 2009-64 (Tabled from 4/13 meeting)
RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF NEW JERSEY LEGISLATIVE BILLS S-2503 AND
A-2872**

Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that these bills were given to them from the Shade Tree Commission and they are regarding the licensure of tree experts. Mayor Fitzpatrick commented that some people were for this and some were not. Mayor Fitzpatrick asked the Municipal Clerk, Mrs.

Janice Lohr to reach out to the Shade Tree Commission and have them attend a Township Committee meeting to explain their position on these bills. Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that they had a letter from the Shade Tree Commission recommending that the Township Committee members sign in support of these bills.

Deputy Mayor Joan Hinkle stated that she is also the liaison to the Shade Tree Commission and she read the entire bill today. Mrs. Hinkle clarified that the requirement could be a two or four year degree necessary to trim trees.

Mark Schmitt, Chairperson of the Shade Tree Commission stated that he felt a two year degree to cut limbs off trees was too much of a requirement and would put an undo burden on the landscapers and professionals that do work in Delanco Township.

Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that she had an expo for the seniors last week and one of the people present was Renee Borstad from Consumer Affairs and she asked her about this bill. Mrs. Borstad said that if you have someone coming to your property to cut trees; that they have to be licensed by the State of New Jersey. Mrs. Borstad stated that the consumer should ask the contractor for his license and insurance before they do any work.

Deputy Mayor Joan Hinkle stated that educating the public is what they should do. A discussion ensued.

Mark Lacina, 100 Maple Avenue, resident and member of the Shade Tree Commission; asked if there is a problem for the need for a bill like this. Mr. Lacina was concerned with the requirements of this bill. Mr. Lacina suggested tabling the resolution until something comes up.

Mayor Fitzpatrick agreed that the public should be educated and put an article in the Beverly Bee or on the Township website. If people have a question about anything regarding any kind of contractor they should call the Burlington County Board of Consumer Affairs.

There was a discussion as to writing a letter to the State or not because the Committee is not in support of these bills.

Maryellen Davison, 216 Center Avenue, was wondering if the State requires a license; are they required to give the Township a copy of their license and insurance information before they are allowed to do the work in the Township.

Bill Matulewicz, 737 Franklin Street, felt that this resolution should be passed.

Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that since there is so much confusion about these two bills; she recommended that the Committee not adopt this resolution at this time but simply educate the public.

The Municipal Clerk, Mrs. Janice Lohr duly noted that Resolution 2009-64 was not adopted.

Deputy Mayor Joan Hinkle mentioned that the Shade Tree Commission chairman was present and she would like him to comment on the Tree City USA Award that will be awarded to Delanco Township this Friday. Mrs. Hinkle wanted to recognize Bill Matulewicz for his 16 years of service on the Shade Tree Commission. Mrs. Hinkle stated that she wanted to take this

opportunity to thank the members of the Shade Tree Commission for their efforts in achieving the Tree City USA Award.

COMMENTS - TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

Joan Hinkle –

- announced that Arbor Day is April 24th and that is the day Delanco Township is receiving the Tree City USA designation –
- on Saturday, April 25th they will be planting two trees on West Avenue – one tree is from the Shade Tree Commission budget – one tree is purchased by the former Mayors known as the Mayor Project

COMMENTS - DEPARTMENT HEADS

Police Department – Lt. Sacalis

- announced that he attended the award ceremony for Adam Tilger at the VFW – commended Adam Tilger for his job as a patrolman and as a detective – thanked Mayor Fitzpatrick and the Township Committee for nominating Adam Tilger for Lawman of the Year

Municipal Clerk – Mrs. Janice Lohr

- announced that tomorrow is the annual School Board Election at the Pearson School and urged everyone to exercise their right to vote

COMMENTS - TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

Ed Devinney –

- attended the VFW meeting honoring Adam Tilger as Lawman of the Year and also the EMS and fire person of the year – nice to see all the local and federal employees that attended the ceremony
- attended Congressman Adler's business roundtable and he runs a nice program – program was regarding help for local businesses

Joan Hinkle –

- attended the award ceremony for Adam Tilger and stated that it was a nice program
- received a notice today that the draft for the energy audit is complete – now goes to the BPU for approval – then it comes back to us with names of people that the Township Committee can hire to do the energy audit
- received today the quotes for the solar panels and the prices have come down – can't do anything for the grant for the solar panels until the energy audit is complete

Mike Templeton –

- attended an energy conference hosted by the Department of Community Affairs, the local Government Services and the Public Utilities Commission – gathered a lot of information
- attended transportation meeting hosted by Congressman John Adler in Mt. Laurel – mentioned the Light Rail parking lot problem in Delanco and the noise from the Light Rail Line
- met with one of Congressman Adler's staff members and discussed the Zurbrugg waterfront to try and secure some funding for that project

Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that she submitted an application to them on February 20th.

Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that Congressman Adler said they looked over the project list that the Township Engineer, Mr. Denton had prepared for that meeting and he chose the Zurbrugg waterfront stabilization project.

Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that there was no reason why you can't submit another application for the same grant because it is not the same grant that she submitted. Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that the list breakdown of projects for Delanco indicated that this project was in the amount of \$200,000. Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that she would be interested in knowing why the price came

up to \$275,000 since February.

Committeeman Mike Templeton stated that he spoke with a representative from Congressman Adler's staff this afternoon and she asked for a narrative and description of the project and an estimate. Mr. Templeton spoke with the Township Engineer, Mr. David Denton today and he indicated that the estimate of \$200,000 was based on just the bulkhead and no other improvements to the potential parkland or to the ramps. Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that she disagreed with Mr. Templeton. Mayor Fitzpatrick read the letter from Jill, a staff representative from Congressman Adler's office in Washington DC that included the specifics for the proposed Zurbrugg waterfront project. Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that she sent the application form and a letter of endorsement to Jill, a staff representative for Congressman Adler.

Committeeman Mike Templeton stated that they are trying to maneuver this into the Transportation Committee to get it under the transportation stimulus funding.

- attended JIF meeting – has not received JIF manual that he requested – found out that outside organizations using municipal facilities do not need insurance policies

Committeeman Mike Templeton will get a copy of the insurance information from JIF so that the Township can notify the various organizations that could use the Municipal Building for meeting purposes.

Marlene Jass –

- attended the Burlington County round table meeting - commented that there is a sustainable New Jersey small grants program – suggested that they take the same project and change the words to apply for the same grant

Committeeman Ed Devinney agreed with Committeewoman Marlene Jass about the amount of grants available. Mr. Devinney suggested having a work session just for grants.

- announced that NJ DOT will be resurfacing Route 130 from Andover Road in Cinnaminson to Bridgeboro and from Edgewater Park to Burlington City – questioned what happens to the Bridge (there is a small section that will not be resurfaced)
- attended the River Route meeting and she has a CD for what is on Channel 28 – River Route Committee is working on the commercial property availability of commercial businesses that will go on their website and is linked to the Delanco Township website
- attended the Joint Land Use Board meeting and reported about the Township Committee's discussion of the Dunes at West Avenue – commented that the Township Solicitor, Mr. Douglas Heinold was investigating the paper streets and Deputy Mayor Joan Hinkle was looking into a grant to pay for a planner - JLUB formed a sub-committee to do a visionary plan for the Dunes A discussion ensued regarding a letter that is required by the Mayor to Gary LaVenja for a grant for planning of the Dunes.

Mayor Fitzpatrick commented about an article in the Burlington County Times regarding a victory for Mount Laurel Township for the zoning of the property at Ramblewood County Club and Golf Course to keep hundreds of homes from being built on a 247 acre property.

Mayor Fitzpatrick –

- noted that Delanco can put in effect zoning or restrictions on the Dunes to protect it from redevelopment or building homes
- reiterated that the Dunes would be a good Eagle Scout project – will submit this information to Keith Letizio to discuss with the Boy Scouts – they could document the paths so that it could be

opened up to the public

Committeeman Mike Templeton stated that if a planner is necessary; it might be worthwhile to get a planner that provides an even handed view of things to conserve the property for the benefit of the Township. Mr. Templeton stated that he was not pleased with the work Taylor Design has done especially the weakening of the treatment of the Dunes in the Master Plan.

- attended the awards banquet honoring Detective Adam Tilger and it was a pleasure to see him awarded for his service to Delanco
- had six different expo table exhibits at the Senior Expo Program – Veterans, Consumer Affairs, Office of Aging, Virtua, Fire Marshall and the Burlington County Library
- budget workshop is scheduled for Monday, April 27th and they hope to be able to put the budget together and present it at the May 4, 2009 Township Committee Meeting – budget workshop meetings are open to the public and they welcome everyone to attend

RESOLUTION ADOPTING 2009 TEMPORARY BUDGET (2nd quarter)

RESOLUTION 2009-69

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING REPLENISHMENT OF THE TOWNSHIP'S AFFORDABLE HOUSING TRUST ACCOUNT

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Council on Affordable Housing ("COAH") authorized the Township of Delanco to adopt an Ordinance requiring developers to pay affordable housing development fees to facilitate the production of affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, COAH's substantive rules at N.J.A.C. 5:97-8.9(a) indicate that no more than 20% of development fee revenues can be expended on administration; and

WHEREAS, COAH has recently reviewed expenditures from the Township's Trust Account and has determined that the Township has exceeded the 20% cap in paying for administrative expenses and that the Township is required to replenish the account from other funding sources; and

WHEREAS, the Township adopts this Resolution authorizing the replenishment of the Affordable Housing Trust Account in the amount of \$55, 008 from other funding sources to comply with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:97-8.9(a).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Delanco that authorization is hereby provided to replenish the Affordable Housing Trust Account from other available funding sources such that no more than 20% of the revenues in the Trust Account have been expended in administrative expenses in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:97-8.9(a).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that appropriations be made in the 2009 budget to satisfy the foregoing in the event that funds are unavailable in the 2008 budget to be transferred to the Trust Account.

RESOLUTION 2009-70

RESOLUTION TO REDUCE PERFORMANCE GUARANTEE FOR CREEKSIDE AT DELANCO, BLOCK 1802, LOT 2

WHEREAS, Creekside at Delanco, LLC has been granted preliminary approval and final approval of development plans for Creekside at Delanco, subject to certain terms and conditions including, but into limited to, the filing for Third Party Performance Guarantees guaranteeing the satisfactory installation of certain on-tract and off-tract public improvements; and

WHEREAS, Creekside at Delanco, LLC has requested a performance bond reduction for an specified amount of work completed in accordance with the procedures set forth in N.J.S.A. 40:55D-53.d that the required improvements have been completed which are the subject matter of the aforementioned and has requested the reduction of said Performance Guarantee for said section; and

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer has inspected the improvements of which notice has been given and has filed a report in writing with the Township Committee and has recommended that the Township Committee approve a reduction to the Performance Guarantee and accept the improvements to date as indicated in the Engineer's letters dated April 9, 2009; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has reviewed said request and report and desires to act favorably with respect to the Engineer's recommendations in accordance with N.J.S.A.40:55D-53.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Delanco, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. That the Township Committee, for the aforementioned reasons, hereby approves the revised reductions of the aforementioned Performance Guarantees filed for Creekside at Delanco, LLC and accepts the public improvements completed to date which are the subject matter of the aforementioned April 9, 2009 Engineer's letter, said public improvements being particularly described in the estimate attached to the aforementioned Performance Guarantee as set forth in the Engineer's report. All applicable property taxes and other escrow charges shall be current.

2. That the Township Committee, for the aforementioned reasons, hereby declares that the reduction of the Performance Guarantee is subject to the payment of all outstanding professional review and inspection escrow fees.

- received a letter from the Delanco Public Library requesting a change in how they receive their funds
- received a letter from the Burlington County Office of Human Services stating that the Riverside/Delanco Township Municipal Alliance Plan for Community Alcohol and Drug Prevention programs has been approved for \$19,000 – contract should be forthcoming

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. STATE BUDGET STATUS

Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that there was a resolution included in the information received from the League of Municipalities opposing Governor Corzine's budget – asked for the Township Committee's opinion to oppose the budget

2. NJDOT GRANT OPPORTUNITIES

Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that a work shop should be set up for grants and set the date at the work shop scheduled for April 27, 2009.

Mayor Fitzpatrick stated that the Township Committee has been working diligently on the budget but they are not where they want to be and would like to make more cuts.
