
HISTORY OPEN HOUSE AT DELANCO TOWNSHIP

The Lenni Lenape of the Rancocas Watershed

Before the Dutch, Swedes, and English Quakers, our region was populated by peaceful indigenous peoples for many thousands of years.

Most recently, in the Woodland Period, the Lenni Lenape camped, hunted, fished and farmed along the shores of the Rancocas Creek.

Our Delanco farmers and their children have been collecting artifacts in our fields and forests for hundreds of years.

Come to see items from the collection of John Burk, whose family farmed along the creek in the early 1900s.

If you have some artifacts, bring them to be photographed and share.
